

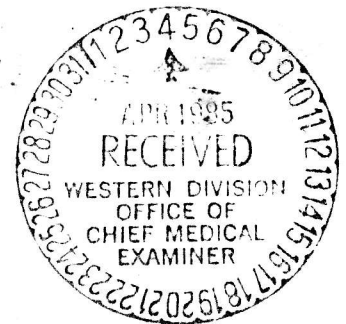

REPORT OF AUTOPSY

Clothing, Personal Effects; External wounds, scars, tattoos, other identifying features:

The body is well developed, well nourished, and clothed. The clothing will be separately described. There is a massive slash wound of the neck which has completely severed the carotid arteries bilaterally, has severed the larynx above the thyroid prominence and has severed both external jugular veins. There are slash wounds on the right lateral cheek, left upper cheek, and mandibular area and there are incised wounds present on the chin. The large slash wound extends approximately 3/4 of the way around the neck and shows large areas of slashing, hesitation marks, and ragged areas over the skin of the inferior portion. The dentition is artificial in the upper jaw and natural and in good repair in the lower jaw. There are approximately 11 stab and slash wounds on the right, left and anterior chest. There is a large defense cut which traverses the right palm. There is a defense cut on the dorsum of the right thumb. There is a defense cut on the lateral aspect of the dorsum of the right wrist. There is a defense cut on the inner aspect of the right arm. There is a defense cut in the web between the left thumb and forefinger. There are 14 stab wounds present in the right, left and midback. The left calf is somewhat larger than the right. There is stasis dermatitis present on both lower legs and ankles. The stab wounds on the back and chest, exclusive of the large wounds of the face, vary in size from 1/2 x approximately 1/8 inch and there is one large slash wound on the right lower chest following the costal margin that measures 4 inches and gapes to approximately 1-inch. The other stab wounds on the chest and back average approximately 1-inch x 1/8 inch in dimension.

Cause of Death:

Slash wounds of neck and stab wound of neck with transection of carotids and jugulars, and perforation of heart.

GROSS DESCRIPTION

The body is opened in the usual Y-shaped manner. There is approximately 150 cc. of blood in the left pleural cavity; approximately 300 cc. in the pericardial sac. The right pleural cavity and peritoneal cavities are dry.

HEART: 320 grams. There is a stab wound entering the apical portion of the left ventricle. This is a combination stab and slash that measures approximately 1 1/2 x 1/8 inch and has perforated the ventricle causing hemorrhage into the pericardial sac. There are no other valve or chamber lesions. The coronary arteries show moderate atherosclerosis amounting in some areas to up to 45%.

LUNGS: 600 grams combined. The pleural surfaces are pinkish tan. The organs show no stab wounds. The tracheo bronchial system contains a very small quantity of blood. The arterial system is not remarkable.

LIVER: 1500 grams. Shows no pathologic changes.

SPLEEN: 150 grams. No pathologic changes.

KIDNEYS: 250 grams combined. No pathologic changes.

ADRENALS: Not remarkable.

PANCREAS: Not remarkable.

GI TRACT: The stomach contains approximately 250 cc. of partially digested food consisting of ground meat, pickles, onion and a very small amount of rice. The remainder of the GI tract is not remarkable.

URINARY BLADDER: Contains approximately 50 cc. of urine.

NECK ORGANS: The trachea is completely severed just above the laryngeal prominence, as are the carotid arteries and jugular veins bilaterally.

BRAIN: 1450 grams. Sagittal and serial coronal sections show no discrete lesions or evidence of injury.

SKULL, VERTEBRAE, RIBS, PELVIS: Intact.

PATHOLOGICAL DIAGNOSES

Kehlkopf

1. Slash wound of neck with transection of larynx, carotid arteries and jugular veins bilateral.
2. Multiple slash wounds of face and chin.
3. Multiple stab and slash wounds of chest and back.
4. Multiple defense wounds of hands, bilateral.
5. Coronary atherosclerosis.
6. Hemothorax and hemopericardium.
7. Stasis dermatitis of lower extremities.

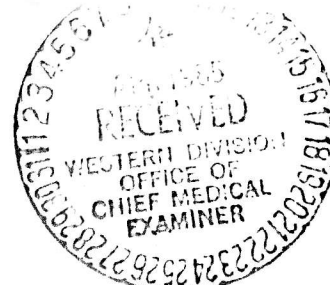

DESCRIPTION OF CLOTHING

Item # 1 consist of a blue/orange velous short sleeved shirt. This is extensively blood-stained and shows multiple stab holes in the back and chest and large areas of cutting and stabbing around the collar and upper portion of the garment.

Item # 2 consists of green work trousers with a brown leather belt. Pockets are empty. The garment is extensively bloodstained.

Item # 3 consist of blue boxer type shorts which are also bloodstained.

Item # 4 consist of a pair of brown support stockings and gray socks.

Item # 5 consists of brown, soft leather moccasin type shoes. These show blood spatters on the upper portion and there is blood on the soles of both mocassins.

The clothing is retained.

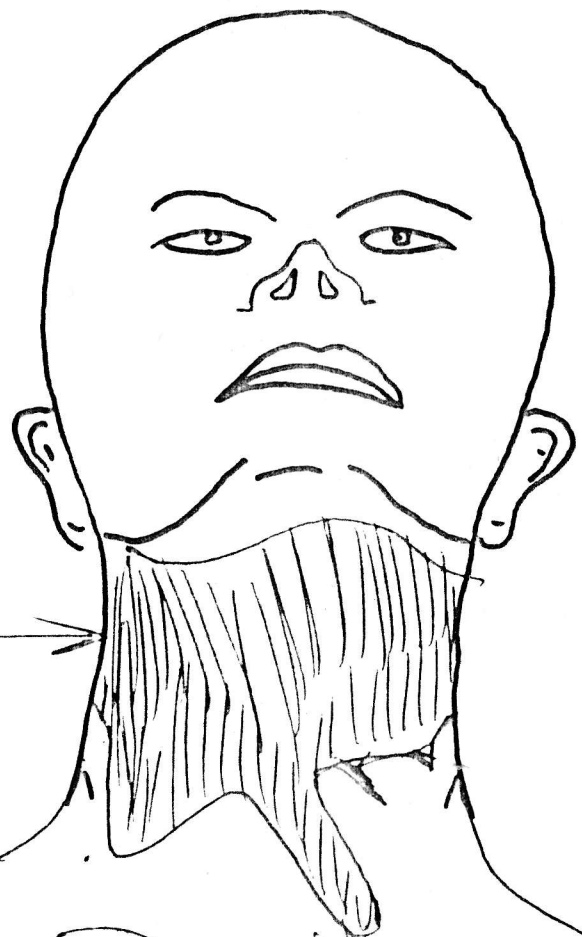
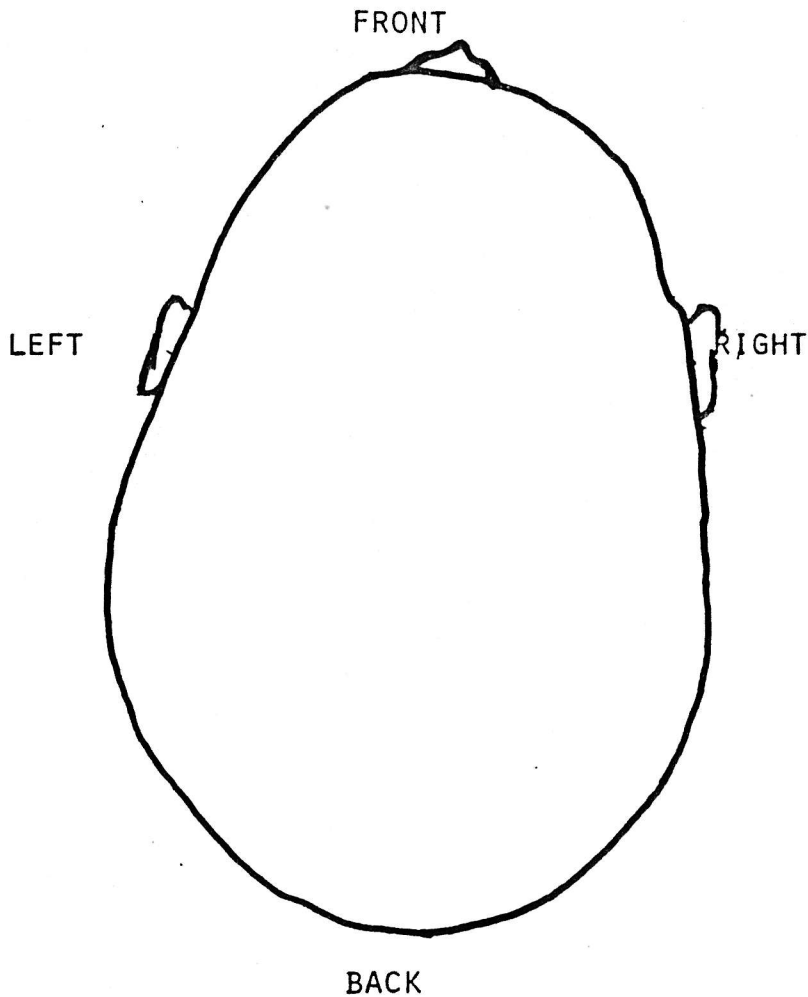

DESCRIPTION OF INJURIES:

NOTE: For a graphic representation of the stab wounds, see the accompanying photographs and body diagrams. Of the multiple stab wounds of the chest and back, one stab wound penetrated the anterior chest and heart to a depth of approximately $3\frac{1}{2}$ inches. One stab wound penetrates the left lateral chest but does not penetrate the lung. One stab wound penetrates the back but not the lung. Depth of penetration for these wounds is approximately 1-inch. The other stab wounds are superficial.

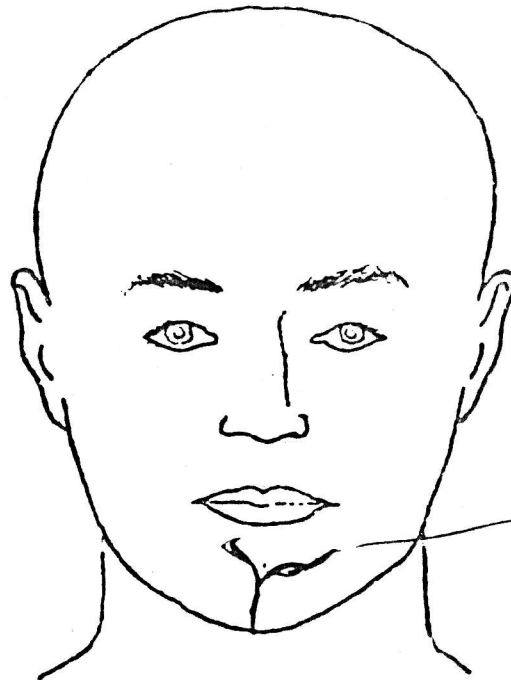

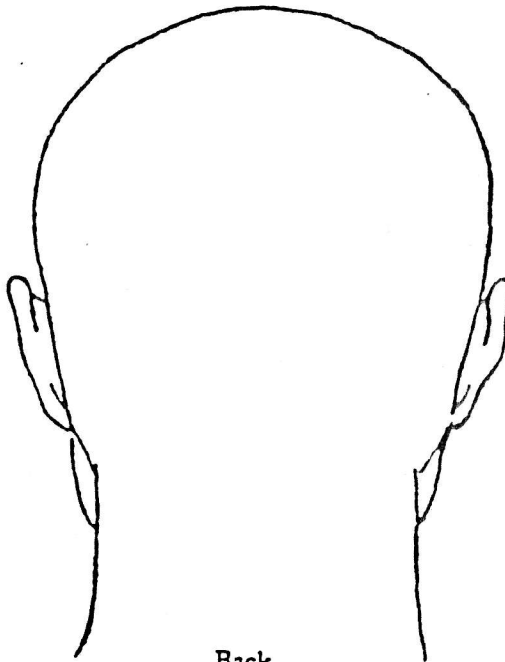
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BODY DIAGRAM—HEAD

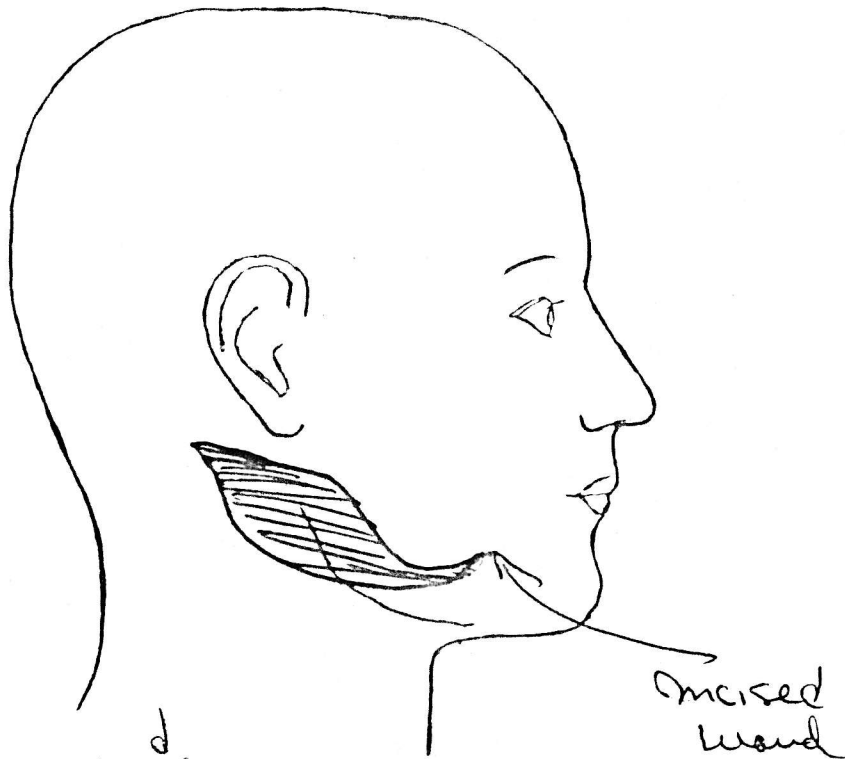
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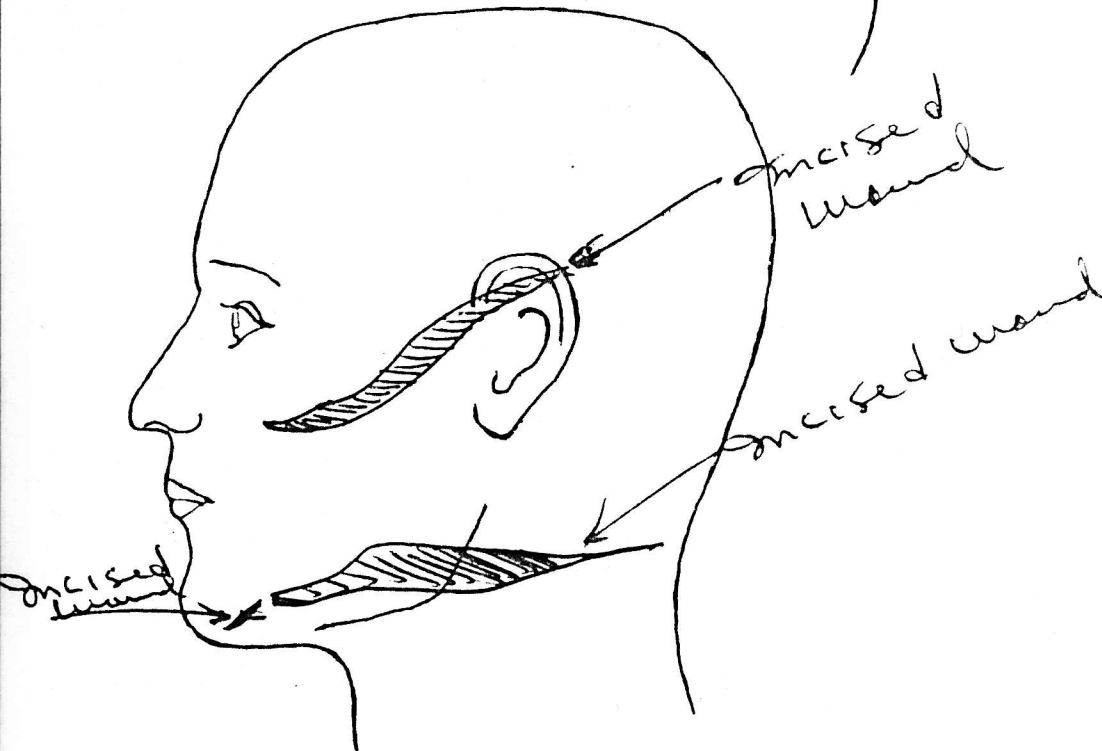
